


The **Maricopa History Museum** building has been remodeled. A ribbon cutting and grand opening will occur on October 22nd conducted by the Mayor of Maricopa, Nancy Smith and the President of the Maricopa Historical Society, Paul Shirk.

Included in the newly remodeled museum will be an exhibit on the Mormon Battalion. The Battalion marched right through what would become the City of Maricopa in December 1846. The museum will also have a Junior Historian program and badge, which will mention the Battalion in one of the activities.

The museum is designed to help the general public learn about the history of the Maricopa area. This will include the Mormon Battalion helping to establish the Gila River trail that would later be used by gold rush Argonauts, pioneers, and stagecoach mail lines. I have found that many people in our area have not heard of the Mormon Battalion and the contribution it made to the history of Arizona.

Nauvoo Community Project



The Mormon Battalion Association collaborates with several church related sites. including the Nauvoo Community Project under the direction of Jill Crandell. Most of the Mormon Battalion members have been included on this website. Some have initial data entry, others have been researched in more detail and are labeled as "foundational" research completed but additional research is needed. It also has a link to Family Search. A number of primary sources are attached to each person including Mormon Battalion military documents. This website is found at http://nauvoo.byu.edu/. The MBA has been comparing their data set to ours and the former Overland Travel data base hosted by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints to spot inconsistencies and make corrections as needed. We want our data base and vital statistics to be as accurate as possible.

There are a variety of educational videos ranging from 5 to 60 minutes in length from our bi-monthly online presentations and others created by the Utah Living History organization. Last year short video vignettes of women with the Battalion or those left behind were created. These can be shared with others.







Sharing the stories!

Staff from the Mormon Battalion Association presented several times this past year in St George. In May, Mary Ann Kirk shared a broad overview of the Mormon Battalion with a historical group. This was followed in September by a reader's theater for the St George DUP narrated by Mary Ann Kirk with storytellers Brad and Dantzelle Allen and Marilyn Adams in costume. This program included life sketches of several women with the battalion and others left behind in first person. A few stories were created specifically to share the stories of a few women who eventually made their way to southern Utah with Battalion veterans.

Also visits were made to the Cedar City and Leeds Cemetery where Battalion veterans are buried along with the Indian wife of soldier Francis Brown who died at Fort Johnson in 1857. These photos include a few examples (Orson Adams, John Brown, Magell Mancheeta Brown). Cemeteries can be a fun place to visit if you are familiar with Battalion names or bring a list along with you.






















What a great experience to relive the past of the California Gold Rush during the days of October 7-9, 2022 at the Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park in Coloma, CA. Service missionaries, in period dress from the California Living History Mission, assisted in hosting thousands of school children and visitors during the three-day re-enactment event. Peter Guilbert, one of the MBA Board of Directors reported that approximately 2,500 school children and over 3,000 visitors participated in a number of early pioneer type activities, games, cannon firing, candle making, wagon rides, branding, log sawing, dutch oven cooking and a host of other booths and historical presentations.

On Saturday, October 8th Brad and Dantzelle Allen, former directors of the Mormon Battalion Historic Site in San Diego and members of MBA and Carl and Pat Witham, former senior missionary couple from the Mormon Battalion Historic Site visited Coloma, CA. Of special interest was seeing the almost completed new "Mormon Cabin" that has been constructed by members of the California Living History mission and financed through generous donations to the California Pioneer Heritage Foundation. The anticipated cabin dedication will be in November 2023. The original cabin was built in 1848 by six members of Mormon Battalion who were employed at Sutter's Mill and were present when gold was discovered.
