

Burial Locations of Mormon Battalion/Volunteers

The total of 496 Battalion soldiers and veterans were buried in at least 22 states and 2 countries outside of the US although histories after discharge and location of 23 veterans, or just over 4%, are largely unknown. Many of those are likely in California. A total of 24 Battalion soldiers or almost 5%, died during Battalion/Volunteer enlistment or after discharge on the trip to join the Saints plus Samuel Boley who was not recognized by the military. It is interesting to see which battalion veterans likely associated with each other in their later years. It was not uncommon for obituaries to mention battalion members who attended or spoke at funerals.

Illustrating the settling of the Utah Territory, just over half of the veterans (263) or about 53% were buried in Utah in all but three counties with about 7 of those in unmarked or unknown sites. Excluding those who died during enlistment in New Mexico and Colorado, at least 53 or almost 11% were buried in surrounding states of Idaho, Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado, some of which (but not all) provides a view of the colonization efforts of Brigham Young. We have identified at least 71 veterans (about 14%) who were buried in California and Oregon. Some of those men had been discharged in California and remained. Others returned later to mine for gold, and some who were sent to establish the San Bernardino colony remained when the Saints were called back during the Utah War in 1857 or returned after. More returned there over the next several decades to make it their home. While many men made their way back east to reunite with their families and eventually returned to Utah, at least 52 veterans or just over 10% made their homes in 16 eastern or midwest states, about half in Iowa. Many of these veterans made contributions to their communities where they were buried although a few of them were visiting family when they died. Those states included Iowa, Illinois, Arkansas, Kansas, Ohio, Missouri, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Virginia, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas. Another six men died on the trail in Nebraska between Iowa and Salt Lake - one going east on his way to Council Bluffs and five on their way west to Utah with family. Four men were buried outside of the US, one who worked in a mining camp in Canada and three who resided in Mexico to escape issues related to polygamy.

An Overview of Battalion Headstones

Grave markers for those buried along the trail during enlistment or shortly after discharge were basically non-existent with the exception of Tragedy Spring where the deaths were recorded on a tree. A few monuments in San Diego honor those who died there during enlistment. Recent efforts have been made to dedicate an estimated place of burial or place some kind of marker or monument to honor those who died along the trail or in Pueblo.

Markers have been located in many different cemeteries in various parts of the U.S including National Cemeteries, recognizing additional individual service in other war related efforts including the Civil War. It is assumed that many burials of veterans may not have had initial grave markers but were added later. Some death or burial locations have never been identified. In a few cases, the original grave was washed away or was moved for different reasons. Land for formal cemeteries were established by local communities. Sometimes a family cemetery was created on the property of the owner and still exists with a small fence surrounding the site or the burial was later moved to an established cemetery. Cemeteries can be landscaped and well maintained by municipalities. Others are merely dirt but maintained by an organization.

In Utah, the headstones themselves vary in age and material. The older headstones are typically made of marble which was brought from Vermont via train after 1870. Sometimes the base was made of sandstone cut out of nearby mountains. Since marble was a softer rock, artisans would carve shapes (columns, urns, arches, etc) and symbols with vital statistics were chiseled into the soft rock (curtains, clasping hands, doves, etc) often reflecting religious themes. These headstones are very fragile and lettering has typically been washed away by rain and modern watering methods. They are often damaged and broken by individuals and grass cutting machinery, causing family members to replace the original headstone. Rubbings on these types of headstones can damage what is left of the rock. After power was available at the turn of the century, polished granite became a more common material and power tools were used to blast out the designs and information placed on the headstone. In the 1950s, the military in Utah made an effort to identify those who did not have markers. Public announcements were made and letters were sent to known family members asking if they would like to order a headstone. A number of simple flat cement type markers could be ordered and were installed. Over time as headstones deteriorated or family members wanted to replace the older ones, more elaborate monuments were erected, typically made of polished granite.

The Mormon Battalion Association has a grave marker to attach to a headstone. It can be ordered at mormonbattalion.com.

They are made with Zinc, 5 3/4" in diameter, and the soldier is in 3D. The supplier suggests attaching the headstone with silicone and after a few minutes put a bead of silicone around the edges to help keep moisture from getting between the marker and headstone. Great way to help honor the Veterans of the Mexican War.

A total of 23 men and boys were officers servants to Mormon Battalion company officers. At least one soldier (Almon Whiting) was also an officer servant for one early pay period. Three servants enlisted as Mormon Volunteers after the Battalion was discharged. Two officer servants and one camp follower died during the one-year enlistment. Four men were camp followers, one of whom was appointed as surgeon. One 18 year-old adult son likely served as a family teamster.

Burial Locations of Women with Battalion

There were 35 women who left with the Battalion from Fort Leavenworth but three more were added from marriages during the Battalion enlistment - 2 in Pueblo and one in San Diego. Three of these women were spouses of officer servants. Two of the original women died during the one-year enlistment - one shortly after leaving Fort Leavenworth, and the other in San Diego. A few women lost their spouses on the trail and remarried either during the enlistment or later after the Battalion was discharged. Some of the women were buried in different locations than their spouse because of divorce, dying before the death of her spouse or moving after his death, remarriage, while visiting family, or other reasons.
